Jesus speaking to Peter... "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18).

Jesus speaking to his disciples... "But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33).

One Saturday, a few weeks ago, we decided to take a family trip to the Philadelphia Zoo. As we were zooming down the turnpike our son, Simon, asked inquisitively, "Mom and dad, 'Why do we take the time to go on these family trips together?"

Amber and I looked at each other for a moment and then she answered by saying something like, "Because we enjoy doing things together as a family. And doing things together is important to us. We thought it would be fun to go to the Zoo together."

"Oh, okay!" He said, "I was just wondering..."

Amber and I then had a lengthy conversation about how we invest in things that are important to us. We talked about how we invest in our family because family is important to us. We talked about how we invest in Friedens because Friedens is important to us. We talked about how we invest in our faith because our faith is important to us. We talked about all the things that are important to us right now in our lives. And we talked about how we make sacrifices for those things that are important to us.

That conversation sent my mind spinning. I began to ponder how we humans truly do invest in things that are important to us. We invest our time, treasures, prayers, and presence in the things that are important to us.

If something isn't important to us then we don't invest in it. If we don't value something then it doesn't get our positive attention. On the other hand it might get our negative attention, but that's a topic for another time.

Bottom line for us is this -- our family is important so we invest in it. Our church home, Friedens, is important so we invest in it. If something is important to us, we invest in it. We make sacrifices for it. If it isn't important, we don't.

Question: where are you currently investing your time, your treasures, your prayers, and your presence? Take a moment and ponder that question... What (or who) do you make sacrifices for? And why?

For Jesus the church was and still is important to him. For Jesus the church was and still is the means for God's Kingdom to come to earth.

Sometimes I wonder if we confuse the two. In my experiences I've come to realize that the church is not the Kingdom. As Matthew reminds us, it is not our responsibility to build the church. That is Christ's responsibility. It is not even our church. It is Christ's church and the church is very important to him (Matthew 16:18). Our task is to be faithful and follow him and his sacrificial ways.

I've also come to learn that if we could somehow see the role of the church in the Kingdom of God then we de-emphasize the church and emphasize what we should be prioritizing – namely life-giving relationship with Jesus and one another within and through the church (Matthew 6:33) for the sake of the world God loves (John 3:16).

Our focus then becomes bigger than the organized church. Our focus become a life lived according to Jesus – who sacrificed everything for a relationship (continued next page)

with me and you (and the world) so that we could live together in a life-giving community.

I've come to learn that the Kingdom of God is bigger than the church. And I've come to learn that the church is to be God's vehicle to bring the Kingdom of God into reality on earth.

For the next month or so, our worship series will invite (challenge) us to see to how a Kingdom of God approach to life reveals what is truly important. We will consider what Jesus told us to prioritize for the sake of the Kingdom of God – things like love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22). In the church and in the Kingdom of God we belong to something far bigger than ourselves...

Where are you currently investing your time, your treasures, your prayers, and your presence? What (or who) do you make sacrifices for? And why?

What is a Sermon Based Semester??????

Sermon Based LIFE groups links a church's small groups ministry with the weekly service. Group members study the same topic or passage of scripture that was covered in the sermon, often delving deeper into areas not covered in detail by the Pastor.

Advantages....

Strength 1. Combining the weekend sermon with a LIFE group study provides repeated exposure to the material covered, which can help it "stick" with group members.

Strength 2. Group leaders are freed from the burden of hunting down new curriculum ideas (or writing their own).

Strength 3. Having all LIFE groups study the same material creates a wider sense of unity and common direction


LIFE GROUPS – connecting you with God & others!

A power mechanism needs to drive a clock, and often that power is unseen ... **Kingdom Power** (*October 17*).


On a Kingdom clock, the face reads times from all over the world ... **Kingdom Inclusion** (*October* 24).


