Then Jesus led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them (Luke 24:50).

This is the image Luke leaves with his readers after the resurrection just before Jesus ascends into heaven. Jesus is blessing his disciples at the end of Luke's gospel.

When I think of this scene, I picture Jesus in a flowing white robe, arms out stretched and gracefully being lifted up into a cloud. I find comfort in this image and verse from Luke's gospel. When ministry gets hard or we find ourselves struggling in the church, I think of Jesus blessing his disciples.

Just think: the last thing Jesus did on this earth was to bless the disciples – to bless us. No wonder the Christian movement has survived and thrived over the past 2000 years! The blessing of Jesus still stands and is at work in us and through us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

We are blessed by our relationship with Jesus to be a blessing to others. This doesn't mean that the form of the church in any given age will remain. It does mean that God's Spirit will be at work confirming Christ's blessing on those who follow him no matter what shape that fellowship or worship or discipleship takes.

I'm convinced that God loves making things fresh and new. That's exactly what Jesus brought – a new teaching, a new way of life, a new relationship with God and each other.

Isaiah reminds us that God has new things planned for us and our lives together in and through the church. "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:18-19).

I love serving Jesus as a leader in his church because I know he is always ready to do something new. And I don't want to miss it. Do you?

I've been reading the book "Killing Cockroaches" by Tony Morgan. Tony points out that as church leaders we need to focus not on the urgent (like killing cockroaches) but on the essentials (like leading the church forward in faithfulness to the one who died and ascended into heaven – Jesus). I wonder what new things God has planned for us next?

I believe God is ready to do a new thing and achieve exciting results in us and through us like never before. We have an opportunity to impact our community by offering people a transforming life through the grace and love of Christ Jesus. Are we willing to do whatever it takes for that to happen and share in God's blessings?

Some people (social scientists, commentators, and even scientists) have predicted over the years that the Christian church is dying. History has proved these predictions short-sighted and wrong every time. The blessing of the ascending Christ will continue... the opinions of the "experts" will not.

I see these predictions as an invitation for self-examination and to make the necessary changes for new life. These death predictions help us clarify why we believe what we believe, and why we value what we value. The form of our faith may change but the fruit of our faith remains the same (see Galatians 5:22-23).

Question: How might you be a blessing to someone today producing good fruit for the kingdom of God?

Prayer: Lord Jesus, as you bless and continue to bless your universal church, empower me to value what you value -- being strong in faith and humble in self examination that I might be a blessing in your name to some one today. Amen.
